Title: Come Down, Lord

READ: Isaiah 64:1-4

KEY VERSE: From old, no one has heard or perceived by the ear; no eye has seen a

God besides you, who acts for those who wait for him. - Isaiah 64:4 (ESV)

Introduction: The crying of the people moves to its high point with a plea to God not only to "Look down from heaven" (63:15) but to actually "come down" to show his presence with his people (verse 1). Throughout this narrative, the people of Judah express their confidence in God, who was present with them in the wilderness, at the altars, the Tabernacles, and the Temple. This fact made their God Yahweh unique and the places He manifested Himself sacred space. Yet, the people are ready to acknowledge their sins. The lament moves back and forth between the people's call for help from God and their acknowledged failure to obey him.¹

How similar to us are the people of Judah? We willingly fail Him until we need His help and then cry out. Our problem(s) is the same as theirs. There is a lack of righteousness. If we expect God to respond to our petition, we must live God's covenant relationship with His son and His people. We must do what God commanded us to do to receive his blessings. If we are faithful to do those things then God will meet, encounter, and interact with (a) those who rejoice, (b) those who act righteously, and (c) those who will remember God and his ways of doing things. We must do good to others without a hidden agenda or the expectation of receiving good.

see. - Hebrews 11:1 (NIV)

The situation above happened to me three years ago, as my family and I were preparing to fly to

the other side of the world to Australia. When my wife and I first received word that our family

would be moving to Australia we were excited, but then COVID-19 happened, and the worry

started to make us uneasy about the move. I prayed to God every day that the transition from the

States to another country clear across the world would be smooth for my family, but something

in me kept thinking about all the negative things that could happen, i.e. our children wouldn't like

their new school, me and my wife wouldn't like our new jobs. So, I arrived at a point where I felt

God was not hearing my prayers because I was not at peace. But that day, on the airplane, God

reminded me that He answers our prayers, He will take care of us, and His mercy is plentiful.

READ: Proverbs 3:5-6

Title: Seeking Divine Wisdom

READ: James 1:5

KEY VERSE: If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. James 145 (NIV)

Introduction: The age-old adage suggests that "wisdom comes with age," encouraging us to think about its truthfulness. Does this statement truly capture the differences between godly and worldly wisdom? Should both be embraced, and do they hold equal significance?

While I admit that there may be a grain of truth in the idea that "wisdom comes with age," my teenage years reveal a lack of knowledge about wisdom and how to acquire it. It seems that the journey of life, coupled with mistakes, serves as a test for gaining wisdom as we progress with age.

An article from <u>Next Avenue</u> defines wisdom as "the use of knowledge for good — for good health, financial well-being, and the betterment of humanity. Basically, wisdom shows up when our choices benefit our overall well-being. For instance, when money is scarce, and there's a tempting name-brand purse for a party, the question becomes: do I pay rent or splurge on the purse? The smart move is paying rent and saving up for the purse over time—a choice that proves wisdom.

Godly wisdom comes from God, aiming to honor godly principles, while worldly wisdom is rooted in the secular world, focusing more on self-interest than divine guidance. Both types of wisdom may have value when blended well in our lives. When seeking guidance, especially for Christians, it's crucial to prioritize divine wisdom.

Title: Thank You (Wisdom)

READ: Daniel 2:20-23 - Wisdom

KEY VERSE: He changes times and seasons; he deposes kings and raises up others. He gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to the discerning. – Daniel 2: 21 (NIV)

Introduction: King Nebuchadnezzar had a dream in which he wanted wise men to interpret. But he refuses to reveal what the dream was in advance. Since the King refused to reveal the dream no one could interpret the dream. King Nebuchadnezzar being infuriated that no one could do as he asked order that they be killed.

Daniel and his associates prayed an effectual and fervent prayer for God to have mercy, to reveal the King's dream and the meaning. God answered the prayer revealing the hidden things to Daniel. Daniel immediately thanked God for answering his prayer and saving him and his friends from being killed. He ushered praise and honor to God for giving wisdom to his servants before even interpreting the dream for King Nebuchadnezzar.

Daniel was shown the power and wisdom of God. Daniel's prayer of thanksgiving acknowledges God's control over kings (such as Nebuchadnezzar and God's ability to disclose the mysteries of life to those who seek his wisdom. God does not give wisdom to everyone in the world, but rather to every believer in Christ who asks in faith. He gives wisdom to the wise. James 1: 5 says "If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him. God gives wisdom generously to those who ask for it in faith."

Merriam-Webster Dictionary defines knowledge as "the fact or condition of knowing something with familiarity gained through experience or association. Knowledge is obtained by reading, researching, and memorizing facts." Wisdom is defined as "The quality of having experience, knowledge, and good judgment. It is understanding the pertinent facts and how it is to be used. Having the power of discernment and judging properly as to what is true or right based on experience and evaluation." We obtain wisdom and knowledge through the studying of God's word. I thank God for the wisdom He has given me through the reading and meditation of His Holy Word. God is all wise, He has all wisdom.

Reading your bible regularly helps to gain a deeper understanding of God's character and His ways. There are many verses in the bible that talks on wisdom:

- For the LORD giveth wisdom: out of his mouth cometh knowledge and understanding. (Proverbs 2:6)

(1 Samuel 1:) Desperation is a poison that turns off your hopes, motivations, and energy little by little. In today's Scripture reading, Hannah uses the most powerful weapon against her enemy-Prayer. Amid her anguish, Hannah finds solace in prayer. Roman Road to Salvation

The Roman Road to salvation is Romans 3:23, "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God." We have all sinned. We have all done things that are displeasing to God. There is no one who is innocent. Romans 3:10-18 gives a detailed picture of what sin looks like in our lives.

The second stop on the Romans Road to salvation, Romans 6:23a, teaches us about the consequences of sin: "For the wages of sin is death." The punishment that we have earned for our sins is death. Not just physical death, but eternal death!

The third stop on the Romans Road to salvation picks up in the middle of Romans 6:23b: "But the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." Romans 5:8 declares, "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Jesus' death paid for the price of our sins. Jesus' resurrection proves that God accepted Jesus' death as the payment for our sins.

The fourth stop on the Romans Road to salvation is Romans 10:9, "That if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." Because of Jesus' death on our behalf, all we need to do is believe in Him, trusting His death as the payment for our sins - and we will be saved! Romans 10:13 says it again, "for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." Jesus died to pay the penalty for our sins and rescue us from eternal death. Salvation, the forgiveness of sins, is available to anyone who will trust in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

The final stop of the Romans Road to salvation is the results of salvation. Romans 5:1 has this wonderful message: "Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." Through Jesus Christ we can have a relationship of peace with God. Romans 8:1 says, "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." Because of Jesus' death on our behalf, we will never be condemned for our sins.

Finally, we have this precious promise of God from Romans 8:38-39: "For I am -convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord."
